What Leadership Needs to Know to Work with the MDS Team (NF)

Is your team ready for the many changes in the year ahead? The past few years have been challenging for the long term care profession, and facility teams are stretched. With new Requirements of Participation introduced in October 2022, a new MDS version set to become effective in October 2023, and the ongoing CMS audits of antipsychotics and schizophrenia, it does not appear we will get a break. With the new MDS version, we also expect changes to quality initiatives, including QRP, Staffing, and Five-Star. Updates will also involve looking at facility policies. MDS and PDPM are team sports; however, due to differences in responsibility, the interdisciplinary team and leadership often speak different languages. This session will enhance the leadership team's knowledge regarding what they need to know to better work with the MDS team and what needs to be in place to ensure compliance with survey and reimbursement.

Improving Healthcare Employee Engagement and Retention Through Impactful Recognition (NF, AL)

CMS's Five-Star rating system is ever-changing. New rules and requirements are added on a regular basis, often impacting a facility's rating, and public perception of care. Providers knowledge of the system paradigm is power—power to improve. Beth Divelbiss will cover the three domains of Five-Star including survey management, staffing/PBJ and quality measures. This session will take a deep dive to explain the how behind the what: how to plan for successful surveys; how to interpret staffing expectations based on daily census and acuity; and how to manage quality metrics to attain a higher star rating.

Important community resources will be shared to minimize the impact of these behaviors on the residential community. A focus on providing residents healthy respect and promoting open communication will be discussed.
