

## Addressing Mental Illness Six-Part Behavioral Health Webinar Series

March 5-7 & 26-28, 2024 | 10:00 - 11:00 am

As the numbers of long term care residents with mental illness increases, the education and training of the staff becomes vital to successfully managing the needs of this population. Unlike dementia, a diagnosis of schizophrenia, bipolar depression, obsessive compulsive disorder, or other chronic mental illness requires a working knowledge of the symptoms and how the disease impacts the individual.

This series is designed to provide basic, common sense information on these mental health challenges. The most effective avenues to assessment and care planning, as well as helping residents to find satisfaction and a quality of life in the management of their disease are central to these conversations.

Each session addresses the following important points:

- overview of the disease: origins and prevalence in long term care;
- assessment; impact of the disease on the patient's life; early signs and symptoms; family history;
- diagnostic procedures; differential diagnosis; co-morbid conditions (dementia);
- behavioral health needs; communication, interpersonal relationships, and productivity;
- pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic interventions; and
- developing a person-centered, person-directed plan of care.
